FROM OUR PASTOR***Pastor's Corner***

November is the month dedicated to remembering our beloved dead. Death does not mean the end. As the prayers offered at a funeral proclaim, "Life is changed, not ended." This past Friday, All Saints' Day, we honored those great men and women who lived extraordinary lives that inspire us even today. Yesterday, All Souls' Day, in our traditional Catholic practice, we not only remember those who have died but they also celebrate their lives as well. An aspect of All Souls Day that has gotten lost in the United States is the doctrine of purgatory which has been overshadowed by different ideals. Since the Second Vatican Council there has not been as much emphasis on prayer for the dead. The liturgical readings during this time of year shift to the end of times when God comes in glory and calls his people home. The Gospel readings focus on the idea that we must always be prepared and they ask us to reflect on the question: Have we lived our lives according to the Gospels? On All Souls' Day we pray and remember our beloved dead. We are also reminded that one day we will follow them and for that reason we should live the Gospel now.

Throughout the month of November we will be celebrating Masses in memory of all of our departed relatives and friends. It is another one of our catholic traditions to note all the names of our beloved dead. These names are placed on the church altar throughout the entire month. If you wish to have your loved ones remembered in these special Masses please use one of the enrollment envelopes at your pews, fill in all the required information and then return the completed envelope to St. Mark's as soon as possible.

Another suggestion for this month of remembrance. In your homes create a dedicated space where you can place photos of your deceased relatives and friends to visually be reminded of them. Pray for them in a special way throughout this month. You can add a flower and even a candle if you wish (please be cautious when using candles in your home). For all of our beloved family and friends, "May their souls, and all the souls, of the faithful departed, rest in peace."

Of course November is also the month that celebrates one of the most favorite of all holidays - Thanksgiving. If we really look around we should realize how truly blessed we all are in so many ways. Sadly, not everyone has even the little that we have. St. Mark's once again is going to help.

On the weekend of November 23 and 24 we will again hold a very special Loaves and Fishes collection of specific items. The items being requested will be food items that will be used to create a Thanksgiving baskets for needy families in our area. Last year, because of your generosity, we were able to help at least 100 families celebrate Thanksgiving. Some items St. Mark's will buy to make sure that particular food items are available. Also, gift cards will be given so that families can purchase a turkey (please do not donate turkeys since we have nowhere to store them). Monetary donations will be most welcome so that we can purchase food items as well as gift cards. If we all try we can make this outreach a great success once again.

On Thanksgiving Day, November 28th, we will once again celebrate our "fantastic and joyful" Thanksgiving Day Mass at 9:00am. If you will be in town please begin your day with us. You are invited!

La Esquina del Párroco

Noviembre es el mes dedicado a recordar a nuestros seres queridos que han fallecido. La muerte no significa el final. Como las oraciones ofrecidas en proclamar un funeral dicen: "La vida ha cambiado, pero no ha terminado". El viernes pasado, Día de todos los Santos, honramos a esos grandes hombres y mujeres que vivieron vidas extraordinarias y que incluso hoy en día nos inspiran. Ayer, día de difuntos, en nuestra tradicional práctica católica, no sólo recordamos a los que han muerto pero también celebramos sus vidas. Un aspecto del día de los difuntos que se ha perdido en los Estados Unidos es la doctrina del Purgatorio, que ha sido eclipsada por diferentes ideales. Desde el Concilio Vaticano II no ha habido tanto énfasis en la oración por los muertos. Las lecturas litúrgicas durante esta época del año se desplazan hacia el final de los tiempos cuando Dios venga en gloria y llame a su gente a su casa. Las lecturas del Evangelio se centran en la idea de que siempre debemos estar preparados y nos piden reflexionar sobre la pregunta: ¿hemos vivido nuestras vidas según los evangelios? El día de los muertos oramos y recordamos a nuestros queridos difuntos. También se nos recuerda que un día los vamos a seguir y por esa razón debemos vivir el Evangelio ahora.

Durante el mes de noviembre estaremos celebrando Misa en memoria de todos nuestros familiares y amigos difuntos. Es otra de nuestras tradiciones católicas recordar todos los nombres de nuestros queridos difuntos. Estos nombres se colocan en el altar de la iglesia a lo largo de todo el mes. Si usted quiere recordar a sus queridos difuntos en estas Misas especiales usen uno de los sobres que están en las bancas, llene toda la información requerida y después lo regresa a San Marcos tan pronto como sea posible.

Otra sugerencia para este mes de recordar. En sus hogares reserve un espacio especial donde puede colocar fotos de sus padres y amigos fallecidos para recordarlos visualmente. Recen por ellos de una manera especial a lo largo de este mes. Ustedes pueden agregar una flor o una vela si lo desean (por favor sean cautelosos al usar velas en su hogar). Para todos nuestros queridos familiares y amigos, "que sus almas, y todas las almas de los fieles difuntos descansen en paz".

Por supuesto noviembre es también el mes en que se celebra uno de los días preferidos de vacaciones – el Día de Acción de Gracias. Si realmente miramos debemos darnos cuenta de cómo estamos bendecidos. Lamentablemente, no todos tienen ni siquiera lo poco que tenemos. Una vez más San Marcos va a ayudar.

El fin de semana del 23 de noviembre y 24 haremos otra vez una colecta muy especial de panes y pescados. Los artículos que se solicitan serán los alimentos que se utilizan para crear una canasta de Acción de Gracias para las familias necesitadas en nuestra área. El año pasado, debido a su generosidad, pudimos ayudar a por lo menos 100 familias a celebrar el Día de Acción de Gracias. Algunos artículos San Marcos los va a comprar para asegurarse de que artículos están disponibles. Además, se darán tarjetas de regalo para que las familias puedan comprar un pavo (por favor no done pavos ya que no tenemos donde guardarlo). Las donaciones monetarias serán bienvenidas para que podamos adquirir alimentos, así como tarjetas de regalo. Si lo intentamos podemos hacerlo una vez más y sera un gran éxito.

En el Día de Acción de Gracias, el 28 de noviembre, a las 9:00am una vez más celebraremos nuestra "fantástica y alegre" "Misa de Acción de Gracias. Si va a salir de la ciudad, por favor comience su día con nosotros. ¡Están todos invitados!



SAFE GUARD THE CHILDREN**How to communicate with those showing inappropriate behavior with children**


How should you communicate your concerns to someone who may be behaving inappropriately with children? The "I" message is a simple way to reframe what you want to say so that the listener hears you speak of your feelings and concerns rather than hearing a complaint against themselves. The "I" message, simply diagrammed is: "I feel" (feeling) when (situation) because (reason). For example, you can say: "I feel anxious when you drive a child home alone after religious education classes because that could put you or the child in a potentially risky situation." It is a much more constructive approach than saying: "You shouldn't be driving children home alone because it is against the rules and puts them in danger."

PROTEGIENDO A LOS NIÑOS**Cómo comunicarse con quienes muestran comportamiento inapropiado con niños**

¿Cómo debe usted comunicar sus preocupaciones a alguien que pueda estar comportándose inadecuadamente con los niños? El mensaje "Yo" es una manera simple de comunicarse con el oyente para que entienda sus sentimientos y preocupaciones sin sentir que es una queja contra sí mismos. El mensaje "Yo" simplemente es: "Yo siento" (sensación), cuando (situación), porque (razón)". Por ejemplo, usted puede decir: "Me siento ansioso cuando conduces solo a un niño a casa después de las clases de educación religiosa porque eso podría poner al niño o a ti mismo en una situación potencialmente peligrosa". Es un acercamiento mucho más constructivo que decir, "No deberías conducir niños a casa porque es contra las reglas y pone a los niños en peligro".
